John A. Fayyad received his MD in 1985 and the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology in both General Psychiatry (1988) and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (1990). Dr. Fayyad is Associate Professor of Clinical Psychiatry in the University of Balamand, Faculty of Medicine and Medical Sciences and the Department of Psychiatry and Clinical Psychology at St. George Hospital University Medical Center. He is also a researcher and a member of IDRAAC (Institute for Development Research, Advocacy and Applied Care), an NGO specialized in Mental Health.

Dr. Fayyad is active in regional and international Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. He is the Secretary General of the Eastern Mediterranean Association of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions (EMACAPAP) and is a Vice President of the International Association for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Allied Professions (IACAPAP).

Dr. Fayyad's research interests include the epidemiology of psychiatric disorders, the effects of war and trauma on children, pathways to resilience, and community interventions. He has published on these topics in international peer-reviewed scientific journals and has authored several book chapters.

His areas of clinical expertise include diagnosis and treatment of all childhood onset psychiatric disorders such as Autism Spectrum Disorders, ADHD, Mood Disorders, Tic Disorders, OCD, Behavioral Disorders, Anxiety Disorders, and Psychotic Disorders among others.
